### Sticky Wickets: What Counts?

WISE and Living Opportunities met with several people from DHS EF & ODDS yester-

day and received an extension and clarification on what placements will "count" toward the outcome payments for this part of the Transformation Project. As well as planning for the future.



**Here is what "counts":** Job placements from Sheltered/Facility-based Employment into Community Integrated Employment (not with any Service Provider) that maintain the job for 90 days.

- Group 1: Between 1/1/15-6/30/16
- Group 2: Between 7/1/15-12/31/16
