



Around the World: New Zealand

- Wise staff were hosted by the New Zealand Disability Support Network. They joined a nationwide Employment Support Leadership Workshop in Wellington and provided insights and feedback on the development of New Zealand's new Diploma Qualification in Employment Support
- The following week they provided three full day Workshops in Auckland, Palmerston North, and Christchurch, training a combined 150 New Zealanders on Discovery, including classroom time and trips into the community to practice informational interviewing with local businesses.




On-Demand Trainings


Webinars

- Our monthly webinars transformed into "Webinar a Day" in late March in response to the pandemic. With support from Washington State and counties, employment agencies were able to access this professional development to sustain themselves during the mandated quarantine.
- Topics at the events focused on supported employment and/or IDD, and many of them spoke directly to how supported employment could be provided during the time of COVID (remote services, market considerations for a changing economy, etc.)


